
Fundraising Team Member—Help to plan and organize support from parents to attend events both internal to the group and in the community, look out for chances for grants, and other ways to raise funding.


**Leaders**—To join a great team of volunteers that help run the day to day aspects of the sections and the evening meeting, camps and trips.






# Census 2018
